

Prior Learning: In Year 3, the children learned how to use a key to read a map/plan. They also began to learn how to use co-ordinates to describe points and navigate around a grid. They recapped their knowledge of the 4 points of the compass and were introduced to the 8 points. In Year 4 the children will continue to develop this knowledge but with greater challenge.
