Orienteering: An exciting outdoor adventure sport that involves navigating between points.

Compass: A tool to find direction.

Grid lines: A series of horizontal and vertical intersecting lines that divide a map into squares, labelled with numbers, to describe a location with a co-ordinate

4-figure grid reference: A co-ordinate made of the numbers labelling grid lines to describe locations on a map.
